### Science Project : Electricity

In our Science Project this week, 6.3 are exploring Electrical Circuits. They have constructed Series and Parallel Circuits using all the key components. They also established an understanding of how fuses work and designed a circuit to show if a fuse has blown out or not. They were given various diagrams of circuits to test their electrical problem-solving skills. They explained why a particular circuit wouldn't work and suggested how to repair faulty circuits. They discussed how to save electricity and also conducted and presented research about Renewable sources of Energy to produce Electricity.
