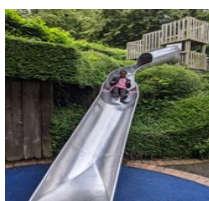
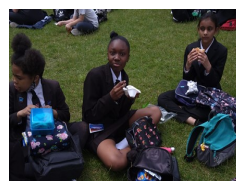
Transition to the Secondary School...
