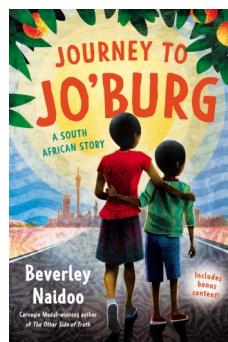
Week ending: Friday, 9 June 2023

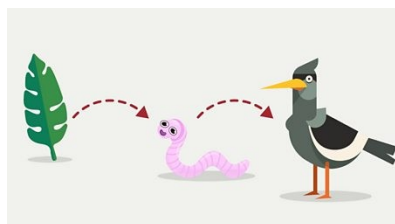

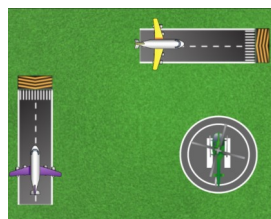
The girls also completed an end of unit test.
