This week, pupils wrote formal and informal letters as characters from the novel Thief. They could identify the features of letters and differentiate between the two letter types. In Grammar, they used the conjunction to show cohesion in writing. They also completed Reading Comprehension where the focus skill was Word Choice.

In Maths, pupils were introduced to the concept of Angles and revised the types. They learnt to use the protractor to measure angles and then calculated angles on a straight line.

Continuing our unit on Hinduism, pupils explored the beliefs of Karma, Samsara and Moksha. They created their own Snakes and Ladders game which represents making good and bad decisions in life.

In PSHE, pupils discussed the positive and negative consequences that being part of an online community can have. They looked at their own responsibilities and the consequences of irresponsible behaviour online. They wrote a personal pledge of how to be a responsible digital citizen.


